The City Council of the City of Gulf Shores, Alabama met in a Rescheduled Council Work Session Meeting on Monday, October 3, 2022 at 4:00 p.m. with Mayor Robert Craft presiding. The meeting was held at City Hall.

Upon roll call, the following members answered present: Councilman Joe Garris, Jr., Councilman Philip Harris, Councilman Jason Dyken, M.D., and Mayor Robert Craft. Councilman Gary M. Sinak and Councilman Stephen E. Jones were absent.

1. Councilman Discussion Period – Jason Dyken, M.D.  
Councilman Jason Dyken M.D. reported he, along with several other Councilmen, had received an email voicing concerns regarding possible target practice going on near the Aventura Subdivision. Further reporting, he has spoken to Gulf Shores Police Chief Ed Delmore who in turn will be coordinating with the Baldwin County Sheriff's Office to determine the best solution to deal with the situation.


Gulf Shores City School Superintendent Dr. Matt Akin made several announcements:


